



Budgets are approved in the October Quarterly Meeting and monitored by your Finance Committee Quarterly.

BAPTIST CHILDREN'S HOME

The Baptist Children's Home annual offering is taken in November. The proceeds from this offering is broken down as follows:



When a donation is made to the Children's Home, it is applied to all the NC Homes according to those percentages.

If funds are specified for the Broyhill home, it is split to the Drake Cottage, Moody Home and Broyhill home.

ANNIE ARMSTRONG EASTER OFFERING

In 1895, an offering was first collected for the work of the Home Missions Board. In 1934, this offering was renamed the Annie Armstrong Easter Offering for Home Missions to honor the work of Annie Armstrong as a tireless advocate for giving, praying and going to share the gospel of Jesus Christ with those who did not know him.

Today, the Annie Armstrong Easter Offering goes to train, resource, and send more than 2,400 missionary families across the United States and Canada. **One hundred percent of gifts** given to this offering goes directly to the missionaries for their use in the field. None goes to administration.



LOTTIE MOON CHRISTMAS OFFERING

The Lottie Moon Christmas Offering is an annual offering collected by Southern Baptists **to support international missions**. The offering was officially named in 1918 by Woman's Missionary Union in honor of the missionary to China who urged churches to start it and give sacrificially.

Lottie Moon was sent as a Southern Baptist missionary to China from 1873 to 1912. She saw firsthand the world's greatest problem — LOSTNESS. Meeting so many people who had never heard the gospel compelled her to write letters to American churches describing the need for a greater missionary presence.

She pleaded for increased prayer and financial support to send and sustain more missionaries. This challenge became known as the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering®.

The offering represents 59 percent of IMB total annual support. Every penny you give to the offering goes directly to support missionaries, including salaries, medical care, housing, transportation, and children's education.

Operation Red Bag:

Are your meds putting you at risk?

Improper use of medicines poses significant risks. Health professionals cite medication mismanagement as the number-one risk to the health of individuals over the age of 65. This age group consumes more than 30% of all prescription medicines—taking two to seven medications daily. As part of its Priority #1: Pre-

vention initiative, NCBAM hopes to place Red Bags into the homes of as many aging adults as possible.

What is a Red Bag?

The red, insulated bag is a perfect place to keep medicines. Having all medicines in one place makes it easy to take medicines to doctor appointments. Storing all medicines (except temperature-sensitive ones) in the bag at all times and keeping the bag in a visible, central place helps emergency personnel locate medicines if a crisis occurs. Temperature-sensitive medicines will store safely for a limited time.
